ELAPHE: HPC-Cloud-based simulation of coupled electromagnetic and structural-acoustics in in-wheel electric motors

FORTISSIMO

Key facts:

<u>Elaphe</u> (Slovenia) produces direct-drive in-wheel motors.

Cineca (Italy) provides tools for HPC.

Challenge:

- Optimisation of noise, vibration and harshness (NVH) characteristics of in-wheel propulsion technology design.
- Development of a production process with less physical prototype assembly and measurement.

Solution:

- A new workflow for an optimisation and automated computation of a detailed acoustic noise map of in-wheel motors.
- The overall noise level of the motors improved by a minimum of 20 dB(A) and up to 60 dB(A).

Results and impact:

- Fewer prototypes and resultant measurements, with estimated savings of €120,000-€150,000 per year.
- Up to 80% shorter time-to-market and at least 80% faster introduction of NVH-related improvements to products.

Key facts:

<u>VICUSDT</u> operates in the shipbuilding industry. <u>WAVEC</u> is a consulting company specialised in offshore renewable industry.

<u>COMPASS</u> is an SME specialising in simulation software.

<u>CIMNE</u> is a research organisation specialising in numerical methods.

Challenge:

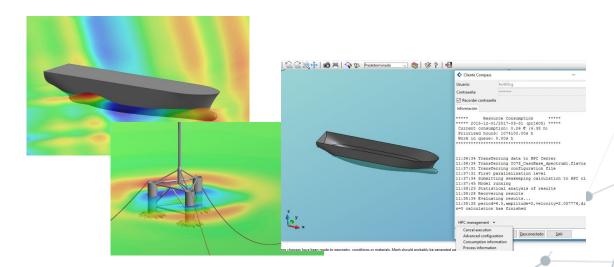
 The use of advanced simulation of a ship or a marine structure subjected to the action of waves.

Solution:

- An overall simulation package including relevant software ported to the HPC-Cloud-based system.
- An effective interface between the end-user and the HPC resources, enabling the simulations to be run from a familiar desktop system.

Results and impact:

- The use of Cloud-based-HPC simulations enables cases to be analysed more quickly.
- Previously infeasible simulations are now feasible paving the way for development of new services.

MIORSE BEAUTY: Process Supervision

Key facts:

TETRA Industriservice Group (Poland) is a metal component manufacturer.

CMBIT is the technological provider.

Challenge:

- Production of custom-design bent metal components used for steel yacht or stair railings and aluminium frames for kitesurfing.
- Currently, they are mostly manufactured using manually operated equipment, which often suffers from repeatability and quality issues.

Solution:

• Fully automated production process, including a combination of a flexible cell-based industrial robot and standard, yet automated, machines.

Results and impact:

- Equipment worth 80,000 euros performing a task of equipment worth of 400,000 euros.
- Solution can be applied to a wide range of different use cases requiring the integration of legacy equipment and existing tools in a complete smart industrial platform, enabling their control and monitoring, keeping a very low cost.

MIORSE COMPLEMANT: Human-centred robot collaboration in an injection moulding process

Key facts:

Ghepi (Italy) operates in the plastic materials field with focus on injection moulding technology. Technological providers are <u>HOLONIX</u> (Italy), <u>SUPSI</u> (Switzerland) and <u>UNIMORE</u> (Italy).

Challenge:

- The component injection moulding is completely automated but still requires on-board machine processing by a human operator for the finishing process.
- Worker's physical and mental stress have a relevant impact on production process and product quality.

Solution:

The use of the cobot in implemented workcell supporting the operator in the different tasks of the process.

Results and impact:

- Improvements in quality control resulting to reduction of quality issues from 2.9% to less than 1%.
- Process productivity increased by 16%, whereas operating costs reduced by 11%.
- Increased the well-being of workers.

MIORSE ENDORSE: Effective Robotic GriNDing of Surface Areas through HORSE framework

Key facts:

<u>ENIKON</u> (Croatia) is specialised company in preparation and final painting of molded interior parts for commercial and business aircraft.

Technological providers are <u>Larics Laboratory</u> (Croatia), <u>ICENT</u> (Croatia) and <u>University of Zagreb</u> (Croatia).

Challenge:

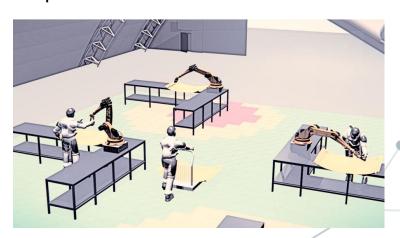
- Although the grinding work cell is automated, and major part of the work is done by robot, 92% of the time the part is handled and processed is still done by human workers.
- Since the grinding produces a very fine dust, the goal is to shorten the time of a human worker.

Solution:

 Deployment of a semi-collaborative industrial manipulator in the process of sanding composite parts for aviation industry.

Results and impact:

- Increasing the number of treated products from 2 to 3, and the robot-ground surface area from 60% to 80%.
- Automated quality control that detects surface roughness on a micrometre scale and localizes it with centimetre precision.
- The scope of this algorithm is not limited to grinding and sanding but can also be applied to various other tasks that require the robot to provide a delicate touch.

Reconcell ELVEZ: Assembly of Automotive Light housings

Key facts:

Elvez d.o.o. (Slovenia) is the manufacturer of specialized products for the automotive industry. The technological providers are <u>Jožef Stefan</u> Institute (Slovenia), the <u>University of Southern</u> Denmark (Denmark), the <u>University of Göttingen</u> (Germany) and the <u>University of Aachen</u> (Germany).

Challenge:

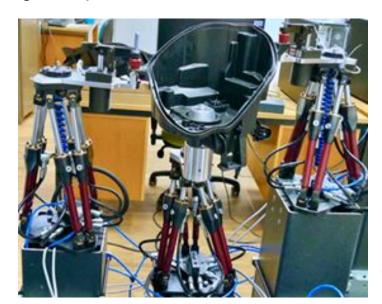
- Manufacturing of automotive light housings requires unique assembly device for different light types.
- Production of spare parts occurs a few times per year, which poses a problem because the large, cumbersome assembly devices must be swapped into the production process.

Solution:

 Passively reconfigurable fixtures that are integrated into the workcell as peripheral modules using a Plug and Produce connector.

Results and impact:

- The reconfiguration time of the production line reduced from hours to four minutes.
- Estimated return time on investment in one year and a half and savings of up to EUR 1.6 million over the next five years.

Reconce HOP Ubiquitous: Flexible Manufacturing of PBC

Key facts:

HOP Ubiquitous is offering a wide range of IoT devices and sensors for monitoring air quality, gas, temperature, humidity, and noise. Technology providers are <u>Jožef Stefan Institute</u> (Slovenia), the <u>University of Southern Denmark</u> (Denmark), and the <u>University of Göttingen</u> (Germany).

Challenge:

- This manufacturing process involves assembly of different printed circuit boards (PCBs).
- Handling orders for a system with multiple configurations presents a key challenge in terms of automation.

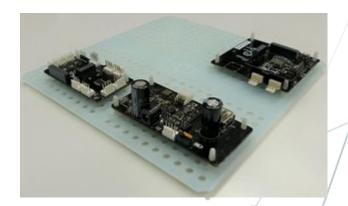
Solution:

 The reconfigurable and modular design integrating various innovative technologies including an innovative spacer gun, and a Power over Ethernet servo gripper was designed.

Results and impact:

- Reduction of manual work and changeover time, and improved assembly quality of PCB boards.
- A payback time is estimated to be 11 months.
- The solution is adaptable and can be used by any company dealing with the assembly of PCB boards.

AMable IK4 LORTEK: Additively manufacturable fittings save energy on earth and in space

Key facts:

<u>LORTEK</u> (Spain) is a technology centre focusing on digitalisation of manufacturing processes, and <u>MTC</u> (UK), and <u>Frederick Research Center</u> (Cyprus) are technology providers.

Challenge:

- Additive manufacturing for a structural component of satellites requires 3D-printed metallic fittings that connects carbon reinforced tubes.
- These fittings need to be light weight and sufficiently robust.

Solution:

 An innovative design that achieved both cost reduction for production and weight saving to minimize energy consumption during the satellite launch.

Results and impact:

45% lighter components produced at half price.

CAPSUle: Cloudification of image analysis for human measure collection for Personalised Safety protection clothing engineering and production

Key facts:

<u>i-Deal S.R.L.</u> (Italy) is a safety protection clothing designer. The end user is <u>TroTusTex</u> (Romania). The technological provider are <u>University of Westminster</u> (UK), the <u>German Research Center for Artificial Intelligence</u> (Germany), CloudBroker and <u>SINTEF</u> (Norway). The DIHs: <u>STAM Mastering Excellence</u> (Italy)

Challenge:

 Currently the measures of the workers and the matching between them and the clothing size is carried out by hand leading to error up to 50%, causing costs for repair and repeated manufacturing.

Solution:

 Novel technology for human measure collection using mobile image analysis.

Results and impact:

 Improved worker comfort and precision of production, reduction of wasted resources due to imprecise human anthropometric data collection, with positive environmental and economic benefit.

EndeF: Optimizing solar panel production

Key facts:

EndeF (Spain) manufactures hybrid solar panels.

NablaDot (Spain) is an engineering company specialising in fluid simulations and IT4Innovation (Czech Republic) is expert in supercomputing.

Cloudsigma (Swizerlands) provides cloud services and Innsomnia (Spain) is an open innovation hub.

Challenge:

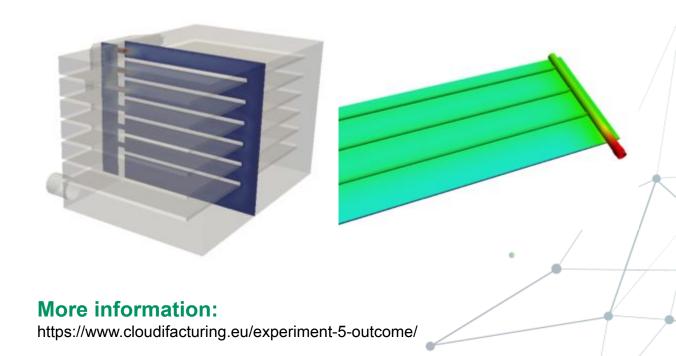
 To minimise the energy consumption and power needed for the lamination process of solar panels, as well as minimising the production time required and manufacturing defects.

Solution:

 A real-time cloud-based process simulation and optimisation model for fluid flows and heat transfer.

Results and impact:

- 20% reduction in manufacturing time and up to 30% reduction in energy consumption.
- The reduction of the manufacturing costs is expected to lead to 10% sales increase.







Fermicloud: Fermentation production optimisation using cloud manufacturing techniques

Key facts:

<u>Fermentia</u> (Hungary) is a contract manufacturer of fermentation technology. <u>SpinSplit</u> (Hungary) is specialising in digital electrospinning products and <u>EssiTech</u> (Slovenia) fabricates microfluidic molds. <u>Sztaki</u> (Hungary) and <u>Innomine</u> (Hungary) are the competence centre and DIH involved, respectively.

Challenge:

- Optimisation of Pichia fermentation process.
- Manual sample analysis and corrective actions led to low product yield and even serious product loss.

Solution:

- A new way for bioprocess optimisation via automatisation and analysing past process data.
- Solution is based on data driven modelling which reduces the response time of the control loop and replaces heuristic decision making by a rule library based on big data analysis.

Results and impact:

 Enthusiastic end-user's reception and prospect of lowering the time specialists need to devote to a single fermentation process from 40h to 17h.

Challenge:

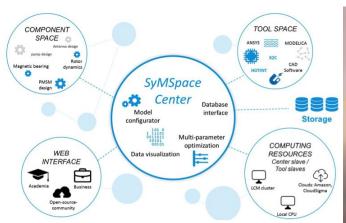
Optimisation of design and production of prototype electric motors.

Solution:

 Set up simulation models for prototype electric motors including electromagnetic, thermal, mechanic and other aspects using a system modeler SyMSpace running in the cloud environment.

Results and impact:

- Very fast and streamlined process of prototyping without human data handover.
- Increased product quality, product flexibility, and reduced design to production time from more than one month to less than one week.
- High potential to scale up.

Chemi-Pharm: Virtualised factory for cost-effective testing

Smart logistics for manufacturing

Key facts:

<u>Chemi-Pharm</u> (Estonia) is a manufacturer of chemical products. System Integrator <u>KINE</u> (Finland) is specialised in 3D modelling and <u>IMECC</u> (Estonia) was the competence centre providing testing facility.

Challenge:

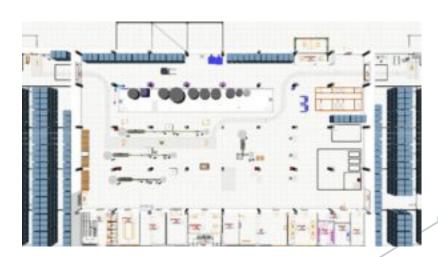
 To reduce the workforce in intra-factory logistics and to achieve better and on-time movement of necessary ingredients inside the factory.

Solution:

- A 3D digital twin of the factory was created in a simulation system to better streamline the production process.
- The project was executed using the Industrial IoT platform OPIL (Open Platform for Innovations in Logistics) together with a 3D simulation tool (Visual Components).

Results and impact:

- Increased efficiency and productivity in logistics processes that contribute to the competitiveness of the company.
- Reduced human error in terms of making entries into IT systems.
- Improved analysis of material flows and bottlenecks, which provided valuable insights into further improvements and to what hardware to invest in.

HAMLET: Mobile robots to increase efficiency by facilitating mould Smart logistics for manufacturing change in footwear factory

Key facts:

Procalcado produces footwear components and moulded footwear. **EWEN** is the solution provider.

Challenge:

 To automate the transportation of moulds, raw materials and products.

Solution:

- Development of EL2OPIL (Event Logistics to OPIL) application, acting as an interface between the OPIL and production planning system.
- EL2OPIL enables automatic delivery of moulds by automated guided vehicles (AGVs) to operators just in time.

Results and impact:

- >50% time saving in setting up the moulding machines.
- 5% increase in productivity of the machines.
- 70% decrease in accidents.

Challenge:

• Improvement of the intra-logistic process by automating transportation of boxes.

Solution:

 Deployment of AGVs (Autonomous Ground Vehicles) and OPIL (Open Platform for Innovations in Logistics) to optimise the material handling process and the routes along which the material is transported.

Results and impact:

The intra-logistics process became more efficient because less time and workforce were needed for transportation.

- 10% reduction of intra-logistics defects and 10% increase in the speed of transport.
- 20% decrease in labour cost.

OHTS4LS: Overhead transport to tackle lack of floor space in the factory

Smart logistics for manufacturing

Key facts:

<u>Devold</u> (Lithuania) manufactures woollen, knitted garments. <u>Factobotics UAB</u> (Lithuania) is the solution provider.

Challenge:

 To search for an automated overhead logistics solution for moving parts of garments between workstations.

Solution:

- Two sub-systems: one to stack and dispatch boxes in the warehouse, and the other one to move boxes on cables over the sewing stations and lower them where needed.
- OPIL modules are used to guide and monitor both systems and to help production supervisors to keep track on garment bundles.

Results and impact:

- Lead time decreased by 9%.
- Transport time decreased by 20%.
- Improved workplace monitoring and resource management.
- Business process optimisation with more efficient routing and production planning.

OPTIFLOW: Automated quality sampling to provide significant time savings

Smart logistics for manufacturing

Key facts:

<u>Dedienne Multiplasturgy Group</u> (France) is specialists in processing of technical plastics. Still (France), <u>EWEN Energy</u> (Portugal) and <u>HMI-MBS</u> (France) collaborated for providing a solution.

Challenge:

- To automate quality sampling.
- Every two hours quality controllers go through the injection molding shopfloor with a trolley and manually pull samples of the product parts. A 250-metre round takes about 30 minutes.

Solution:

 Replacement of manual work by an AMR (Automated Mobile Robot) connected to the OPIL framework

Results and impact:

- Time savings of a minimum of 6 hours per day, which is almost a full working day of one employee.
- The opportunity for quality controllers to go deeper into root cause analysis which may lead to improvements of manufacturing processes.
- Improved ergonomics.

RIOgistics: Replacing forklifts with robots to speed up intra-factory logistics

Smart logistics for manufacturing

Key facts:

EMKA Sealing Systems (Spain) manufactures rubber profiles that are used for sealing in the automotive sector. Bosonit (Spain) is the solution provider, and Robotnik (Spain) provided the robot.

Challenge:

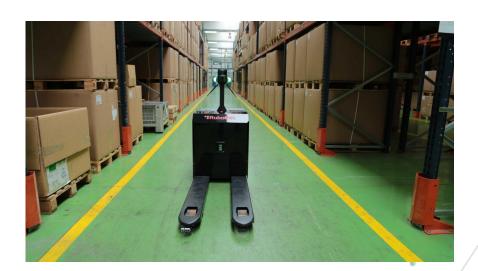
- To automate intra-factory logistic processes which need conventional forklifts.
- As conventional forklifts require drivers, a considerable amount of time of the operators is spent on transportation of semi-finished and finished products.

Solution:

- Replacement of forklifts with collaborative mobile robots.
- Altogether seven sensors were added to the factory floor to guide the robot, and both the robot and the sensors integrated to the OPIL platform.

Results and impact:

- Speeding the logistics process by one hour per day.
- Relieving employees from operating the forklift.

RobOPIL: Robotic Collaboration for OPIL based Logistic Solutions

Smart logistics for manufacturing

Key facts:

MYL (Spain) manufactures and repaires special machine tool spindles. <u>LINQcase</u> (Spain) provided intelligent automation solutions and <u>Ceit</u> the robotic software.

Challenge:

 To improve logistics between the warehouse and workstations and partially automate intra-factory logistics by automatically deliver components weighing less than 12 kg.

Solution:

 Replacement of manual logistics with two robots: an AGV (Automated Guided Vehicle) and a stationary collaborative robot arm.

Results and impact:

- Cut downtime caused by intra-factory logistics from around 20% to almost 0%.
- Increase weekly assembly capacity from 15 spindles to 19 spindles.
- 26% improvement of overall productivity.
- 100% traceability of components used in each assembly and repair process.

SMARTIST: AGV's transporting small parts

Smart logistics for manufacturing

Key facts:

<u>Bazigos SA</u> (Greece) is a SME manufacturing high precision tools and equipment, such as moulds and dies. <u>Casp SA</u> (Greece) is small software company.

Challenge:

 To support intra-factory logistics of unique workflows by use of AGVs (Automated Guided Vehicles) for transporting small parts.

Solution:

 Replacement of manual transportation of small parts by AGVs. Machine operators call an AGV to the workstation, load half-finished products on it and send it to the next workstation. All orders would be given on tablets or smartphones and directed to AGVs by OPIL modules.

Results and impact:

- 20% of space was saved in the shop floor.
- Labour and ergonomics costs related to intra-factory logistics were cut by 70%.
- Time spent on intra-factory logistics information was reduced by 65%.

VCLMP: Voice controlled logistic system for automation in meat production

Smart logistics for manufacturing

Key facts:

Nedeljkovic (Serbia) is a slaughterhouse and meat processor. Solution provider is <u>NO Solutions</u> and technology providers Faculty of Technical Sciences at <u>University of Novi Sad</u> (Serbia) and <u>University of Heidelberg</u> (Germany).

Challenge:

 Improving the traceability of meat to the level that the final product can be traced back to one single animal.

Solution:

- A voice-controlled logistic system that enables full traceability in meat production.
- Main components are an AGV (Automated Guided Vehicle) with a robot arm which replaces workers in every possible situation.
- Traceability was achieved by using NFC and RFID tags on every meat hook and meat box, and by distributing readers and writers all along the production process.

Results and impact:

- Important cost savings, mostly driven by lowered costs of nonconformance.
- Improved customer and employee satisfaction.

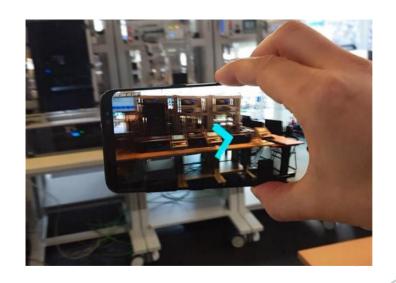
 To realize the integration of cutting-edge awareness technology (object tracking, real-world interaction, user localisation in complex environments, augmented reality).

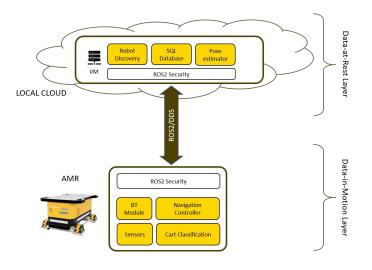
 To develop a proof-of-concept edge-cloud application based on the MIDIH reference architecture (RA) to enhance the performance of the Omnit Autonomous Mobile Robot (AMR).

Solution:

 Dual-level recognition application using onboard vision sensors, in near-real-time, to generate a probability map of carts in the viewport of the robot as it approaches the parking area.

Results and impact:

 Reaching out to new potential customers and establishing a demonstration showroom.

Challenge:

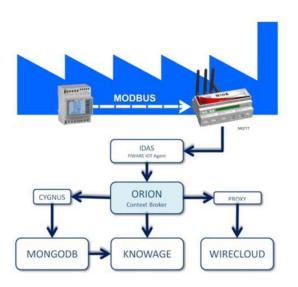
